Volunteer Medical Transportation Program: A Lifeline for Our Community

Since its inception, volunteer medical transportation has become a vital part of community care across the nation. Programs like ours have empowered volunteers to help their neighbors get to essential medical appointments.

After a pause due to the challenges of the pandemic, Camano Center was proud to restart the program in 2021. Since then, the demand for rides has tripled. In 2024, we expect to surpass 750 ride requests that we will be able to fill by year-end. This rapid growth underscores the increasing need for transportation services in our community, and our volunteers are at the heart of it all. They offer more than just a ride—they provide conversation, companionship, and the peace of mind that comes from knowing someone cares.



This year, we're excited to announce that our Volunteer Medical Transportation Program will be part of Giving Tuesday on December 3rd through the Stanwood Camano Area Foundation (SCAF).
