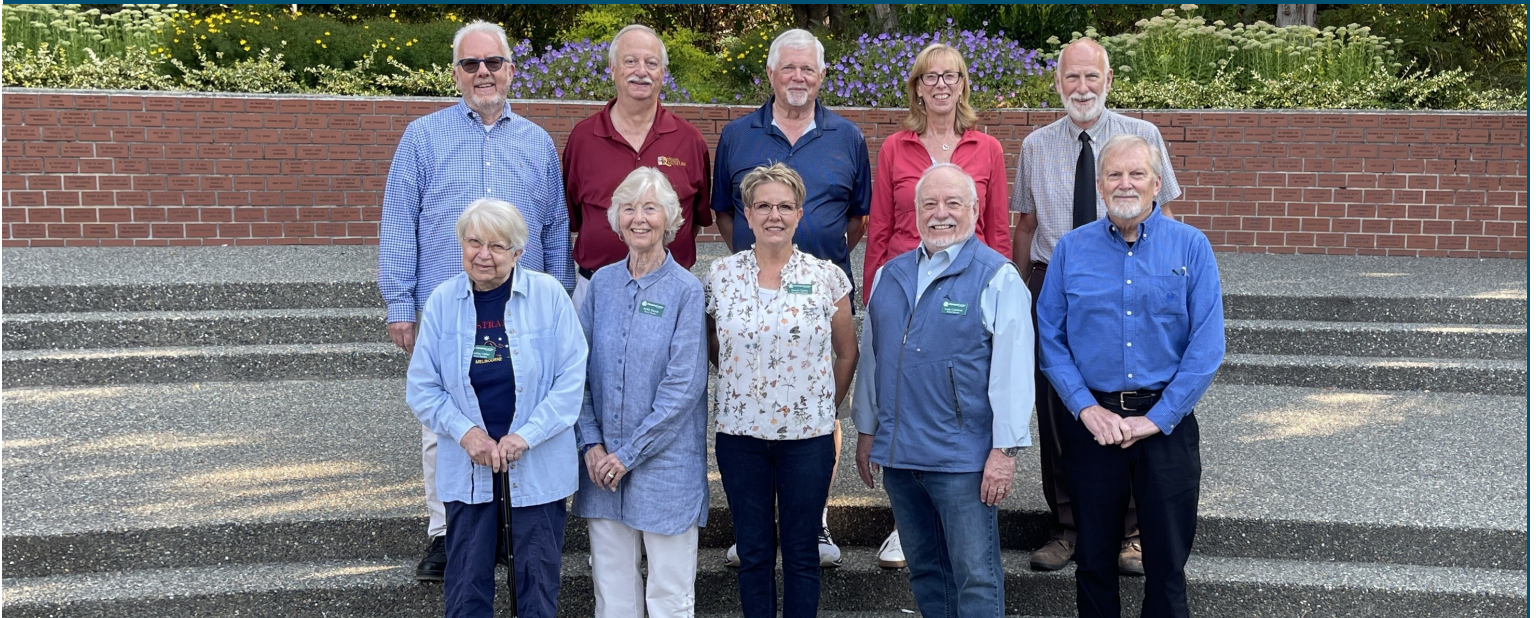

Past 30 Days:

- The Volunteer Appreciation event was well attended and a very nice afternoon of visiting, great food, and lots of thank you's! Thank you Larry and Lisa for speaking to the group about how important they all are to our organization!
- During the month staff split up lists of volunteers and made phone calls to thank individuals for being our volunteer. This was a fun activity and we heard a lot of very nice feedback.
- Our insurance policy has been signed with Church Mutual, moving from NPIP. This move will provide more coverage, and support, and yearly savings that are significant.
- Bonnie met with our two prospective new board members for the 2026-2027 fiscal year. Both will be great additions should they be voted in at our General Membership meeting in July.
- The power point slide deck for the meeting will be sent out to Board members once some updates to it are made. If you have a slide to talk about to the membership we will let you know.
- The remaining flooring project for the Education and Craft rooms will be done in June during our closure week. We are assessing the amount of staff we will have working and list projects for completion such as light painting, and cleaning. Closure week will be moving to January, so next one will be in 2028.
- The Women's Expo was a fun event, back for the 2nd year after COVID. Some vendors dropped out at the last minute which was very disappointing since our advertising told attendees what they could look forward to. Net profit for the event was \$8,875. Great job to Julie, for coordinating and running it. Next year we will be changing the date to February due to all of the competing things in the summer.
- Karen, Leah, Paul and I met with Betsy Griffith who provides outreach to homes on Camano to assist case managers with behavior health related issues. We have learned we can refer community members to this service through CARES, NWRC and Camano Center. We hope to further our partnership with Island County Public Health and Human Services by meeting about what we are each doing.
- SBA van came out to help Camano residents apply for low interest loans if they had storm damage from the December winds. Not many had claims which hopefully is a good thing.
- Island County Transit came out for several hours to help our lunch participants and all members here with information about the bus system. There is currently a survey available to help them guide the next 20-year planning.
- Karen's Wellness Committee will start meeting on May 28th. This will help direct us on what topics and programs the Center focuses on.

- Don Hall the Director of Annual Giving from Island Senior Resources came out to meet with me and learn more about the Camano Center. We had a good discussion about marketing to Camano residents and eliminating confusion and misleading statements.
- Bonnie met with Janet St Clair to discuss the Nutrition program on Camano and what developments she is aware of. She will keep me informed when she hears updates.
- CFC will have their 2nd party for the club and its members and loved ones on May 29th with a Hawaiian theme. This will be part of membership benefit to the club and their families and will be budgeted for the 2026-2027 upcoming organization budget.
- Island County Transit has formed a Community Advisory Committee that will help the Board with long range planning. I have been selected to join the committee for Camano Island. Training will start May 27th.
- Budget draft for 2026-2027 is almost complete for Board review.
- Solar + Storage grant has been modified to extend the deadlines, as the project was significantly delayed due to PUD upgrades on the island. Part of the grant reporting is 1 year of usage after fully functioning so the date will be moved to June 30, 2027 in order to accomplish the last requirements.
- Several nominations have been made for Camano Center, 2nd Chance Thrift, Julie Abbott, Traci Smith & myself with SC News and the Seattle Times. More information when voting starts!

Camano Senior Services Association Annual Membership Meeting

July 28, 2025 3:00 p.m.

Camano Center

Welcome and Call to Order: The annual membership meeting of the Camano Senior Services Association was called to order by President Kathy Sanchez at 3:00 pm on July 28, 2025 at the Camano Center, 606 Arrowhead Rd, Camano Island, WA. 98282.

Kathy Sanchez welcomed those in attendance and introduced members of the Board of Directors. Vice President, Larry Carlstrom, Treasurer Shirley Swanson, Secretary Connie Johnson, Paul Foster, Jeff Highland, Michal Scott, Kelly Kraus, Darlene Miller. Executive Director Bonnie Eckley, an *ex officio* member of the Board, was also present. Board member Ken Johnson was excused.

In addition to Board members, thirty members of the Corporation were in attendance. It was determined that a quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes: On a voice vote, the Minutes of the 2024 Annual Membership Meeting held on July 22, 2024 were unanimously approved as presented. The Minutes were published in the Camano Connections newsletter two months prior to this meeting as required by CSSA Bylaws; copies were made available to members present.

President's Remarks: President Kathy Sanchez began her remarks by noting that the Executive Director and Committee chairs will share much more detail about the work of the Board this year as the meeting continues. Then, she highlighted four significant items. The Camano Center is a thriving organization, with strong programming and strong resources to meet the needs of seniors and members of the community. The Association is in a solid fiscal position, strengthened this year by the engagement of Stordahl Capital Management to oversee an investment strategy and provide financial advice. Kathy noted the near-completion of a grant-funded installation of solar panels and storage battery, which will allow the Camano Center to provide a safe place for island residence during power emergencies. Kathy stated that the 2nd Chance Thrift Shop is flourishing, providing a needed service to our community. Finally, Kathy highlighted the Strategic Planning Process, which included information gathered from Center members, staff, and Board members, and resulted in a new three-year plan to guide future decision-making at the Camano Center.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Shirley Swanson presented the Finance Committee Report. Highlights included

- Total Revenue for 2024-2025 totaled \$2,015,381
- Total Expense for 2024-2025 totaled \$1,297,319
- Net Ordinary Income for 2024-2025 totaled \$166,062

\$552,000 of income from the solar grant was not reflected in Net Ordinary Income because it was paid out immediately as an expense. The \$552,000 expense will be reflected over time through depreciation expense. Currently it is still in fixed assets, so for the purpose of reporting net ordinary income for the

meeting, the \$552,000 was taken off the bottom line as it would be deceptively high. Depreciation will start as soon as final payments are made on the solar project.

To provide additional clarification of the Treasurer's Report, Bonnie Eckley handed out a June 30, 2025 year-to-date Balance Sheet.

Endowment Committee Report: Committee Chair Larry Carlstrom presented the Endowment Committee Report. In fiscal 2025 Stordahl Capital Management assumed Investment control of the Camano Center Endowment Fund. A Stordahl management team attended the March Board meeting and presented their portfolio review. The merger of the Quasi into the True Endowment was finalized. Previously authorized contributions to the endowment were executed during the year. The Board continues to defer any additional contributions, anticipating that contributions will resume as major projects currently underway are finalized. For most of 2025, market volatility impacted investment results. The Quarter ending June 30, 2025 was positive with a 3.7% investment value increase. As of June 30, 2025, the ending balance in the True Endowment was \$808,307. Questions were asked regarding the closing of the Quasi Endowment, noting that its purpose was to provide funding for unexpected opportunities and emergencies. It was explained that a short-term investment account, funded at \$500,000, has been created to cover such extraordinary expenses. It is also managed by Sordahl Capital.

Board Development Committee Report: Committee Chair, Kelly Kraus, presented the Board Development Report. During the past year, the Committee

Facilities Committee Report: Committee Chair, Paul Foster, presented the Facilities Committee Report.

Projects included:

- Re-roofing the Camano Center building
- Completing solar/generator grant project
- Creating five additional parking spaces at the 2nd Chance Thrift Shop

- Planting trees on wetlands property at 2nd Chance Thrift Shop
- Exploring building addition options to Center
- Replacements to kitchen equipment at Center
- New carpet and flooring throughout most of the Center
- New security cameras and alarm at 2nd Chance Thrift Shop
- New Gate at 2nd Chance Thrift Shop

Executive Director's Report: Executive Director Bonnie Eckley presented the annual Executive Director's Report. Highlights of the Report included:

- Enumeration of significant maintenance challenges, some unexpected and others the result of aging buildings and infrastructure
- Solar grant awarded and the work is 80% complete
- New partnerships in the community
- Education topics—grief, technology, scams, downsizing, brain and exercise, caregiver support
- SAIL classes transitioned to Camano Fit and Steady
- Old Friends Club transitioned to Camano Friends Club

The FY 2026-2028 Strategic Plan is nearly finalized. Five Goals focus the Plan:

Goal 1: Grow and strengthen financial sustainability.

Goal 2: Increase awareness and engagement to optimize our impact to the community.

Goal 3: Maximize program and service impact and participation.

Goal 4: Strengthen organization as a “place based” nonprofit center.

Goal 5: Become the best nonprofit in the region at which to work and volunteer.

Old Business: There was no old Business.

New Business: Members in attendance were invited to vote on members of the Board of Directors. Kelly Kraus spoke briefly about the credentials and interests of the two new nominees for Board positions. Using paper ballots, the following individuals were elected: Larry Carlstrom and Kelly Kraus were renewed for second 3-year terms on the Board; Judith Shoudy and Dale Wagner were elected to 3-year terms as new members of the Board.

For the Good of the Order:

On behalf of the Board, Kathy Sanchez expressed gratitude to the staff and volunteers for their time and dedication to the Camano Center. She expressed grateful appreciation to our many donors, and she thanked the members of the Corporation in attendance for participating in the Annual Membership Meeting.

Larry Carlstrom, Vice President of the Board of Directors, spoke briefly about the service of retiring members of the Board; Linda Hadley—4 years, Board Development Committee; Shirley Swanson—4 years, Treasurer of the Board, Chair of the Finance Committee; Connie Johnson—7 years, multiple years as Secretary; Kathy Sanchez, 8 years, multiple years as President and Vice President. Larry Carlstrom and Bonnie Eckley presented each retiree with a card and flowers.

Before adjourning the meeting, Kathy Sanchez reflected on her years of service and leadership on the Board.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m. by President Kathy Sanchez

Bylaw Amendments

The Board of Director of the CSSA has endorsed three amendment to the Bylaws of the Camano Senior Services Association. These Amendments will be considered for approval at the Annual Membership Meeting on July 27, 2026. The endorsed amended wording is highlighted in **bold**.

Amendment 1: Relating to time of Annual Membership Meeting, Article II —MEETINGS

1. ANNUAL MEETING—At least one meeting of the members of the Corporation of the Camano Center shall be held in each calendar year except as other wise determined by the Board of Directors, the regular annual meeting shall be held at **3:00 p.m.** on the fourth Monday of July at such location designated by the Board.

Amendment 2: Relating to Ex-officio Members of the Board, Article III—DIRECTORS

12. **EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS**—the Executive Director of CSSA shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors and serves by virtue of office. The Board of Directors may appoint by majority vote other ex-officio members who may provide specialized knowledge or hold organizational roles which enhance Board expertise. Such ex-officio members must be of lawful age and members in good standing in the Corporation and will be reviewed for reappointment annually. Ex-officio members may participate at Board meetings and serve on committees but do not have voting rights and are not counted in quorum calculations.

13. REMOVAL—Any member of the Board of Directors, Officer of the Board, **ex-officio member**, employee, or agent my be removed by majority vote of the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interest of the Corporation will be served thereby.

Amendment 3: Relating to Indemnification, Article X—INDEMNIFICATION

INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS—The corporation shall indemnify its officers, directors, employees and agents to the greatest extent permitted by law or as otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation. The corporation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation or who is or was serving at the request of the corporation as an officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, other enterprise, or employee benefit plan, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity or arising out of any status as such, whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

Gardening Above Ground



Growing vegetables doesn't have to mean working at ground level. If bending or kneeling is difficult, or if your front porch, patio, or deck is the most convenient place to garden, containers offer a practical way to grow fresh food in a space that works for you. A well-planned setup can make planting, watering, and harvesting much easier to manage.



If you're new to growing food in containers, Snohomish Conservation District's, [*"Tiny Spaces, Tasty Harvests: A Beginner's Guide to Growing Food in Containers"*](#) is a great place to start. Here are a few

practical tips to help you create a container garden that's both productive and easy to care for.

Start with what you enjoy eating

What do you crave? Start by focusing on crops you'll look forward to harvesting, eating fresh, and using in your kitchen. Then match those choices to your growing conditions—especially sunlight. Most vegetables and fruits need at least six hours of direct sun each day, so choose a location that meets that requirement and is easy for you to check on regularly.

Select your location

Edible gardens don't need to be relegated to backyards. Within a sunny area, consider a range of accessible and even unorthodox locations for containers—lining a driveway, on a lawn, along entryways, or other underused but practical spaces.

The best location is one that fits naturally into your daily routines, making it easy to tend plants without extra effort or strain. Because containers dry out quickly, you'll thank yourself mid-summer for choosing a location close to a spigot or where you can keep a full watering can. If you need to sit to plant or harvest, ensure a small stool can be placed next to each container.

Choose your containers

Get creative! Many household items can be repurposed into planters as long as they have drainage holes.

Using a variety of container sizes allows for a wider range of crops. Carrots and tomatoes need deep pots but lettuces can grow in containers only six to nine inches deep. Mixing container sizes helps make efficient use of space.

Vertical options such as hanging pots, trellises, tiered stands, or anchored shelving units can also help bring

plants to a more comfortable working height and expand growing space.



Plan for protection

Deer, rabbits, birds, and squirrels love gardens as much as we do! Lightweight plant cover (reemay) and hardware cloth (¼-inch wire mesh) can help keep animals from eating your seeds and digging up your young plants.

As plants grow, you can make a removable covering with a wider wire mesh or polypropylene mesh, but if deer visit daily you may want to fence off your growing area completely.

With a little planning and ingenuity, container gardening can make it easier to enjoy fresh vegetables and fruits with limited space and without the strain of traditional ground-level gardening.
